CanCOVID

If you or any of your organization's researchers are engaged in COVID-19 research, please consider connecting to the newly established CanCOVID network. This is a national network of Canadian COVID-19 researchers, clinical collaborators, and healthcare stakeholders. It is designed to promote collaboration, coordination, and communication to

facilitate research. The network is interprofessional and interdisciplinary in nature and operates using *Slack*, an easy-to-use, online messaging platform that organizes real-time group discussion into team-specific and topic-specific channels. Ultimately CanCOVID's mission is to enable the agile, evidence-based decision-making needed to help steer Canada safely through the COVID-19 pandemic.

CanCOVID is accepting registrations from recognized experts in the COVID-19 research and response community, including the following areas:

### **2020 SWAHN CONFERENCE**

Our fall conference is currently scheduled for Thursday, October 15, 2020. We are looking into the possibility of planning a virtual conference this year. More details will be provided in the coming months.

### INTERPROFESSIONAL EDUCATION (IPE) DAY

The Planning Committee for IPE Day 2020 is scheduled to meet in June to debrief this year's event and to begin to discuss plans for the future. Before and after the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, leads from a few participating programs approached SWAHN to inquire about increasing the number of their students at future events. Other program leads with no previous engagement in IPE Day also reached out to express an interest in having their students join the next event. These requests, if accommodated, would increase the student cohort in London by 50% to 1,200. While this interest is a wonderful testament to the Planning Committee's efforts, given the current social distancing restrictions associated with COVID-

### **PALLIATIVE CARE**

**SWAHN palliative care curriculum research** – All data from SWAHN's Palliative Care Project Team study has now been collected related to entry-to-practice education and training for nursing and practical nursing programs in the SWAHN region. The programs in this study include those at Fanshawe College, Lambton College, St. Clair College, Western University, and the University of Windsor. Data analysis of the alumni survey responses as well as transcripts from faculty focus groups is currently in progress. A Project Team meeting to discuss the results and next steps has been scheduled for June.

### **CHOOSING WISELY**

Implementation of a Multi-Faceted Opioid Reduction Strategy for Southwestern Ontario: A Pragmatic Stepped Wedge Cluster Randomized Trial – This project is currently on hold as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

### **NUTRITION**

Perioperative Malnutrition and Frailty in Older Adults Undergoing Elective Surgery – A retrospective study. – The team is awaiting the status of a funding proposal that was submitted in early March 2020 for its retrospective study. There are no other updates to provide with respect to the Project Team at this time.
